Purpose

This procedure sets out the uniform requirements for students and outlines the requirements of staff when students are not in the correct uniform.

Overview

Our Reddi community recognises the importance of our school image within and beyond the Redcliffe community. The P&C Committee will be asked to endorse the Redcliffe State High School Student Uniform Policy annually. This Student Uniform Policy is compulsory for all students when:

- Attending or representing the school during school hours
- Travelling to and from the school
- Engaging in school activities or functions out of school hours.

Pride in both personal presentation and being part of a community are important qualities that our Student Uniform Policy aims to develop. Therefore, our students are expected to wear the full school uniform every day without any alterations or additions.

Redcliffe State High School Student Uniform Policy contributes to a safe and supportive teaching and learning environment through:

- Ready identification of students and non-students at the school
- Fostering a sense of belonging
- Developing mutual respect among students among students by minimizing visible evidence of physical, economic and social differences
- Minimising exposure to hazards by adopting uniform items that enhance Workplace Health and Safety (WHS) practices.

At Redcliffe State High School, we actively encourage students to take pride in themselves and their school, and we encourage students to demonstrate this by presenting themselves in a neat and respectful manner.

The purpose of our Student Uniform Policy is to ensure a strong commitment to pride and the values of the school; Connect, Learn, Succeed.



Responsibilities

Management Responsibilities

- Enforcing aspects of the Student Uniform Policy relating to safety such as footwear, eye protection and hats.
- Resolving uniform issues where physical impairments, economic hardship or cultural/ religious/personal or LGBTQ+ issues are raised by families.
- Develop systems that provide alternative arrangements on written request from a parent e.g. providing loan garments, exemption for a period of time e.g. shoes.
- Resolve conflict by offering loan items, inform parents of recurrent issues, mediation with family either with school and/or representatives of community.
- Resolve any ongoing issues through adherence to the school policy – Student Uniform Policy – this policy has been created and modified through the Parents and Citizens Association. The policy is reviewed as a minimum, annually.
- Support staff to ensure students are in the correct uniform

Teacher Responsibilities

- Check uniforms in every class
- Follow processes for students in incorrect uniform

Student responsibilities

- Wear the correct uniform when attending or representing the school, travelling to and from school, or engaging in school activities outside of school hours
- Follow processes when not in correct uniform

Parent responsibilities

- Ensure their child has access to the correct uniform
- Contact the school if support is required

Process

1. Staff to check uniforms in every class (uniforms are outlined below).
2. Staff to send students to the SABER Centre Check-in Counter for incorrect shoes or clothing items, including the Sports Uniform on Tuesday and Friday.
3. Staff to ask students to remove any excess jewellery.
4. If students refuse to follow instructions about uniform, send them to the Reset Room.

Sanctions for instances of non-compliance can be enforced by HOYs, HOD-E and DPs, and include one of the following:

- imposing a lunchtime detention
- preventing attendance or participation in any activity where the student is representing the school
- preventing attendance or participation in any school activity that is not an essential school education program



Uniform Requirements

- School uniform items only to be worn each day
- Fully black, leather/vinyl or athletic shoes/joggers (nothing above the ankle or canvas) with black laces

A Student Uniform Policy in Queensland Schools is supported by the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006* (Qld).

The Student Uniform Policy covers clothing worn by students, including head and footwear and other aspects of personal presentation of students. Any request for modifications to the policy must be formally requested through the P&C and school administration before approval on an individual basis.



Formal Uniform

The Formal Uniform is worn by students on every Tuesday and Friday of the school week. Formal Uniform is voluntary on all other days of the week unless specifically stated. Our juniors (7, 8 & 9) and seniors (10, 11 & 12) have a different shirt worn with their formal uniform.

Students are permitted to wear the school jumper, school hoodie, royal blue or black slacks with the appropriate Formal Uniform. Student must wear either a skirt or long pants when wearing a School Blazer. School tracksuit pants can only be worn with the sports uniform (tracksuit pants are not to be worn with the Formal Uniform).

Formal Uniform is mandatory for many occasions. Listed below are examples when students **MUST** wear formal uniform and thus present our school in an appropriate image:

- Every Tuesday & Friday
- School photographs
- Participating in Awards evenings
- Being a public representative of the school, eg. Student Youth Council
- Public speaking / debating
- Anzac Day Ceremony
- Anzac Day March
- School trips / excursions (unless otherwise stated)
- Meeting visitors to our school
- Cultural trips

Senior Formal Uniform

Year 10, 11 and 12 students must wear the senior uniform.

Junior Formal Uniform

Year 7, 8 and 9 students must wear the junior uniform.

Sports Uniform

The Sports Uniform can be worn by students on every Monday, Wednesday and Thursday of the school week

- Shorts – Royal blue 'Redcliffe' sports shorts
- Polo Shirt – Blue sports shirt with emblem
- Socks – Plain white ankle, calf or knee-high length socks (no sockettes)
- Shoes – Joggers (completely black) nothing above the ankle or canvas/must have a visible arch, with black laces
- Track Suit Pants – Only to be worn with sports uniform
- Track Suit Jacket
- School Jumper – Royal blue with logo
- School Hoodie – Royal blue with logo



Other Uniform Expectations

School Hat

It is encouraged that all students to wear the school hat. No beanies, bandanas or sweatbands may be worn. Programs of Excellence students may wear the PoE Cap.

Year 12 Jerseys

- Can only be worn by year 12 students
- Name on back of jersey shall only be the surname/first name of student
- Not to be worn on excursions, formal events/activities or when representing the school or as approved by the school

Jewellery

Jewellery must be kept to a minimum. Only the following items are acceptable:

- Two plain small studs/sleepers in each ear
- One small nose stud is permitted, however, sleepers/rings in any other part of the body must be covered with tape under Workplace Health and Safety regulations
- Watch (smartwatches not accepted)
- Single, flat ring
- A chain link necklace may be worn if it cannot be seen
- A necklace connected to a significant cultural, spiritual or religious meaning may be worn
- Insignia on any jewellery worn must be appropriate
- No anklets are allowed.

In some subject areas and for some activities, Workplace Health and Safety Regulations may require the removal of all jewellery and consideration of length of fingernails. Common sense will be used governing the wearing and safety of other jewellery.

Other

- Hair ornaments and make-up must be minimal
- No anklets are allowed
- Fluoro/vibrant or unnatural hair colours are not permitted as part of our school uniform. (spray on colours for sporting carnivals/school activities will be the only exception)
- In the case of make-up, foundation only – eye shadow or lip colour is not acceptable
- If nail polish is worn, it must be clear polish or muted/light colour. Students will be required to remove any coloured nail polish.
- In some subject areas and for some activities, Workplace Health and Safety Regulations may require the removal of jewellery, length of fingernails or long-sleeved shirts.
- No undershirts are to be worn. If they are visible the student will be asked to remove the undershirt
- We would appreciate tattoos be covered at school events where possible

Purchasing Uniforms

School uniforms are available from **The School Locker**, a third party firm based in North Lakes. New uniforms can be purchased in store or online.

The **P&C Uniform Shop** located on campus only sells 2nd hand uniforms and provides sizing opportunities.
