## PARENT COMPASS ACCESS



Compass is a school management solution that allows parents and carers to access up-to-date and meaningful information about your school and your child's progress. Compass includes many different features, including the ability to:

- Monitor your child's attendance, and enter an explanation for absence or lateness
- Communicate with your child's teachers
- View your child's timetable and the school calendar
- Book parent-teacher conference

If you have provided 100 points of identification at the time of enrolment (if you have not, please see the enrolment officer), you will be sent an email invitation to the compass education platform with a temporary password that you will be required to change on your initial visit to the application. This will be sent at the start of the school year so keep an eye out and check your junk folders.

## BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE (BYOD)

### DEVICE SPECIFICATIONS

Please review our minimum device specifications to ensure that the laptop you choose will be adequate for your student to use for several years to come. The cheapest devices to buy may not be the most economical over the life of the laptop (usually minimum 3 years depending on individual use). Consider included components, technical support, warranty and accidental damage arrangements. Upgraded laptop specifications will generally provide better performance over a longer period of time, depending on individual usage.

In order to use a BYOD device at RSHS there are also a number of apps and settings that must be maintained by the parent/carers and/or student. ## PAYMENTS AND PERMISSIONS

### PAYMENTS BY QKR!



with  masterpass

The tuckshop and school payments can use a mobile app called Qkr! (pronounced 'quicker') which enables consumers to order and pay for goods and services directly from their smart device.

Qkr! Accepts all major credit and debit cards accepted by the school (Visa and MasterCard) and you can register more than one card within the app. The Qkr! App is available from the Apple App store and Google Play. If using an iPad you can download the iPhone version of Qkr! or go to the online site at [Qkr!](#)

### PAYMENTS BY EFTPOS

Payments can also be made through EFTPOS whilst on campus. Students are encouraged to have their own key-card for EFTPOS purchases using paypass on mobile devices is not permitted during school hours.



### PAYMENTS BY BPOINT

Payments for school fees including Student Resource Scheme (SRS), excursions and camps will be invoiced and can be paid via BPOINT. Parents are encouraged to use this simple and convenient pay point for direct payment of school based invoices by using the BPOINT code aligned with specific invoices and by accessing the [BPOINT portal](#).

### QPARENTS ACCESS

QParents is a user-friendly portal accessible via app or web browser, providing parents with secure online access to information about their child's state schooling.

You may already have access to QParents from previous school enrolments or siblings at other schools. If this is the case, once your student becomes an active enrolment at Redcliffe SHS, you will automatically have access to QParents. If you do not already have an active QParents account, parents will be nominated by the school within a week of their student commencing at the school. You will then need to register with QParents to access the portal. See 'Registering for QParents' for further information.

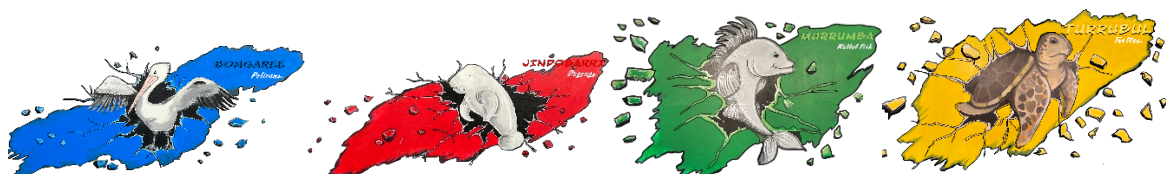

### 2026 JUNIOR SECONDARY STATIONERY LIST

Students will participate in 6 subjects each semester. Some subjects are 10 week rotations, whilst others are year long core subject programs, meaning your child will likely need at least 10 exercise books for the year.

On top of this, **it is recommended that you prepare to purchase 3 or 4 more A4 exercise books in Semester 2.** When your student gets their timetable, you will know which (if any) of the subjects you will need to purchase any additional resources for. They will change their elective each term, so it is a good idea to have books ready to go for the beginning of each term.

The Student Resource Scheme or SRS payments cover all other consumables used for learning.

Semester 1, 2026 commences for teachers on 22 January and for students on 27 January.

### Staff professional development days

Staff professional development days for teachers are 22 and 23 January, 16 and 17 April and 4 September 2026. Schools are able to decide when they undertake the required hours for professional development for the flexible days, as long as they are on the flexible days, in the school holidays or out of school hours.

### Public holidays

Queensland public holidays are set by the Minister for Industrial Relations.

Public holidays for local show days are not shown due to diversity of dates across the state.

### Final dates for student attendance

20 November is the final date for Year 12 attendance for receipt of a Senior Statement. 27 November is the final date for student attendance in Years 10 and 11.

Some schools in regional, rural and remote areas will close for the summer holidays on 4 December.
